Practice Sheet

This practice sheet has been designed to monitor your progress whilst carrying out private practice. As you can imagine there can be no substitute for learning car control skills and how to deal with different road situations with a professional driving instructor before going out to practise privately. When you have enough confidence, your instructor will advise you what and where to practise. They can also advise the person who is going to supervise you. Practise on as many different types of road as you can, in all sorts of traffic conditions, in the dark and on dual carriageways where national speed limit applies. You may be asked to drive on these roads during the test. Don't just concentrate on the exercises involved in the test.

Important Note: - When you practise try not to obstruct other traffic. Most drivers are tolerant of learners, but don't try their patience too much. Try not to annoy local residents; for example, don't repeatedly practise emergency stops in the same quiet residential streets, or reverse repeatedly around the same corner. Your instructor will show you how to use this sheet and talk through with you what you have done.
